Opening doors

Lent for me, like Advent, is about opening doors. Seeking to make that connection between God and my life. Ash Wednesday always seems to come around too quick but once I have started I mostly enjoy it. Our difficulty this year is that it comes on top of lockdown. If we're struggling already, Lent can seem like an extra burden. And yet hopefully it is our faith that is helping us to get through this.

One Lent I was lucky enough to go on Retreat to Buckfast Abbey in Devon. Walking the lanes as Spring was beginning was a tonic in itself. But one evening another priest and I went for a walk not realising that they locked the door after night prayer. On our return we were locked out! One of the monks had his room above the door and his light was on. To our embarrassment we had to shy stones against his window to get him to let us in. We didn't make the same mistake again.

How is your prayer going? Some have talked about their prayer deepening through the pandemic, others have said they are finding it more difficult. Perhaps we feel as though the door is locked and we are shying stones at the window to be let in. Remember in the Gospels that it is the cry of the heart that is often answered. The father of the sick child who says to Jesus "I have faith, help the little faith I have!" The blind beggar who shouts out "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Whether we find prayer difficult or not the genuine prayer is always the prayer of the heart.
